## Establish Defensible Space Around Your Home



**0-5 feet**

Non-Combustible Zone

**5-30 feet**

Lean, Clean, and Green Zone

**30-100+ feet**

Wildland Fuel Reduction Zone



NFPA documents in their report, Brush, Grass and Forest Fires 2018, that the Fourth of July was the peak day for wildfires started by fireworks, followed by July 5. Annually, local fire departments responded to an average of 4,430 brush, grass, and forest fires on July Fourth, more than five times the daily average of 840.

- ✓ **Create a fuel free zone 0-5 feet from all structures with no combustible materials**
- ✓ **Clean your roof/gutters of leaves and needles**
- ✓ **Clear dead wood and dense combustible vegetation near your home**
- ✓ **Remove all dead and dying vegetation including weeds, tree limbs, and branches from property**
